## CHAPTER XCII.

*An Act to legalize the election of Town Council and the Board of Education of the Town of Minneapolis, held in and for said Town on the 7th day of June, A. D. 1858.*

SECTION 1. Legalizes a certain election for Town Council and Board of Education.

2. Act takes effect on passage.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. The election held on the seventh day of June, one thousand eight-hundred and fifty-eight, in the town of Minneapolis, in the county of Hennepin, for the purpose of choosing the officers composing the Town Council of the said town, and also the officers composing the Board of Education of the town of Minneapolis, is hereby declared to be in all respects legal and valid, and the several persons declared elected at such election to the respective offices in said town, shall respectively, if qualified, or as soon as qualified, be deemed and regarded as duly chosen to such offices, with the like power and effect, and for the same period as though they had been legally elected.

### *An Act to authorize the re-survey of the Town of Senter-ville.*

SECTION 1. Survey of the Town of Senterville authorized.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*
