CHAPTER XXVIII.

An Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to Incorporate the Minnesota Central University, passed and approved March fourth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

- SECTION 1. Amendment to Section 12, Chapter 36, of Laws of 1854—Meetings of Trustees.
2. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That Section twelve of Chapter thirty-six of the laws of 1854, be amended so as to read as follows:

Meeting of trustees
Sec. 12. The Board of Trustees may meet on their own adjournment, any five of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the President, with the concurrence of two Trustees, or any four Trustees, may call special meetings of the Board by giving notice to the members thereof, in writing, or otherwise, at least ten days before the time of such meeting. And any Trustee may be removed for neglect of duty for more than one year.

SEC. 2. This Act shall be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XCIX.

An Act to authorize the Common Council of the City of St. Paul, to issue Bonds for certain purposes.

- SECTION 1. Common Council authorized to issue Bonds of city, on demand of Board of Education.
2. Manner of issuing bonds.
 3. Prohibits the bonds from being negotiated at a less rate than their par value.
 4. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the Common Council of the City of St. Paul shall have authority, and are hereby authorized and required, on demand of the Board of Education of St. Paul, to issue Bonds of said city to an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars, bearing interest at the rate of twelve per cent. per annum, and payable at any time not exceeding five years after the date thereof.

SEC. 2. Said Bonds shall be issued by said Common Council and signed by the Mayor of said city, and Clerk of the Common Council to the Board of Education of the city of St. Paul, payable to their order, and shall be charged to and be paid out of the school fund of the city of St. Paul, and said Common Council shall make provision for the payment of the principal and interest of said Bonds, when the same shall become due or payable.
