

the other acts herein provided for; and as compensation therefor, the Surveyor General may demand and receive the same fees as he is entitled to for other like services.

Discharge of lien SEC. 10. Whenever any person who may have filed a claim of lien as hereinbefore provided for, shall have received his wages and costs in full in any manner, he shall, on the demand of the owner of any logs or timber upon which such claim was made, or of the assignee of such owner, give a receipt of the same to such person, which said receipt being filed and recorded in the office of the Surveyor General, shall be deemed a discharge of the said lien.

Repeal of former laws SEC. 11. All acts and parts of acts giving or reserving a lien upon logs or timber to persons performing labor thereon, except Section nine (9) of Chapter ninety-seven (97) of the Revised Statutes aforementioned, are hereby repealed.

SEC. 12. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage; *Provided*, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to effect any contract entered into, or any right accrued before the time of the passage hereof.

CHAPTER XX.

An Act to amend an act entitled "An Act to provide for County Organization and Government" approved February 28th, 1860.

SECTION 1. Amendment of act passed February 28th, 1860.

2. Act to take effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That Section thirty-two (32) of Article two (2), of "An Act to provide for County Organization and Government," approved February twenty-eighth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, be repealed, and the Sections be renumbered so as to conform to this amendment. Repeal of section thirty-two of article two

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

CHAPTER XXI.

An Act prohibiting the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors to Indians.

- SECTION 1. Penalty for selling intoxicating liquors to Indians.
2. Justices of the Peace to have power to determine such cases.
3. Indians to be competent witnesses in such cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Any person who shall sell, exchange, or give, barter or dispose of any intoxicating or spirituous liquors or wine to an Indian, whether within the Indian country or without the limits thereof and within this State, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail, not more than three months nor less than twenty days, or by fine not exceeding one hundred (100) dollars nor less than twenty-five (25) dollars, or by Penalty for selling liquor to Indians
