

CHAPTER XXXV.

An Act to authorize the Secretary of State to audit certain accounts for Newspapers.

- SECTION 1. Secretary of State to audit and settle accounts for newspapers.
2. Accounts to be verified by oath of publisher.
 3. Secretary to draw warrants in favor of such publishers.
 4. Act take effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized and required to audit the accounts of the several newspaper publishers for papers furnished the Legislature during the present session, and to settle such accounts, allowing said publishers at the rates at which said newspapers are furnished at the places of publication.

SEC. 2. Such accounts shall be verified by the oath of the publishers that the papers were ordered either by the Chief Clerk of the House, or the Secretary of the Senate, or the persons to whom they were sent and furnished, and that the said accounts are just and true as to the number and price, as provided in the preceding Section.

SEC. 3. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the State Treasurer in favor of the respective publishers for the amounts found due to them; and there is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury (not otherwise appropriated) a sum sufficient to pay such accounts so audited.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
