expires within one year, or has expired, and which have not been redeemed, shall be extended for the further time of one year from the former period of redemption. And the proper officer on the payment, within three months after the passage of this Act, of all taxes assessed on said lands prior to the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, is hereby required to abate all interest thereon, and in like manner, if payment as aforesaid is made within six months, to abate fifty per cent., and if paid within twelve months twenty per cent. of all such interest.

SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LII.

An Act to provide for the assessment and collection of a Tax for State purposes for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty.

- SECTION 1. Tax of four mills on the dollar to be levied for State purposes.
2. Duty of Collectors.
3. Act to take effect from and after passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Tax to be levied
for State purposes
for 1860

SECTION 1. There shall be levied on all the taxable property in the State of Minnesota, for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, a tax of four mills on the dollar for the use of the State, including the sum to be raised as a sinking fund, and for the interest of the State debt under the provisions of

an act entitled, "An Act to authorize a loan of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars to defray the current expenses of the State," approved March thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the proper officers of the several counties of the State to assess and collect said tax in their respective counties, and pay the same over to the Treasurer of State in the manner and time prescribed by law. Duty of collectors

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LIII.

An Act for the Protection of Sheep.

- SECTION 1. When dog killing or worrying sheep may be killed.
2. Owner of dog liable for injury done sheep.
 3. Penalty for injury committed by dog after being notified.
 4. Person assaulted by dog may notify owner and shall receive treble damages for injuries sustained thereafter.
 5. Person harboring dog ten days previous to injury to be deemed owner.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. If any dog shall be found killing, wounding or worrying any sheep or lambs, it shall be lawful for any person to kill such dog at any time before such dog shall have
