CHAPTER LXXXVI

An Act making appropriations for Incidental Expenses in the various departments of State.

1. Appropriation for incidental expenses in State departments.
 2. For salaries of clerks, - - - - - \$2,700
 3. For postage, stationery, &c., - - - - - 2,365
 4. For fuel and lights for Legislature and State officers, 700
 5. To provide shelter for ordnance, - - - - - 75
 6. To aid in distribution of laws, - - - - - 100
 7. Appropriations how paid out.
 8. When Act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of five thousand nine hundred and forty (5,940) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the following items of incidental expenses in the various departments of State, for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to wit:

Appropriation for incidental expenses of 1860

SEC. 2. For the salary of the private secretary of the Governor, four hundred (400) dollars.

For private Secretary of Governor

For clerk hire in the office of the Auditor of State, one thousand (1,000) dollars.

For clerk hire For clerk hire in the office of the Secretary of State, six hundred (600) dollars.

For clerk hire in the office of the Treasurer of State, six hundred (600) dollars.

For clerk hire in the office of the Attorney General, one hundred (100) dollars.

All of which salaries and sums for clerk hire shall be paid upon the certificate of the several executive officers in whose department such service is rendered.

Postage &c. in Governor's office SEC. 3. For postage, stationery and other incidental expenses in the Governor's office two hundred and fifty dollars.

Contingent fund For an Executive contingent fund for State purposes only, one thousand (1,000) dollars.

Postage &c. in Secretary's office For postage, stationery and other incidental expenses in the office of the Secretary of State, two hundred (200) dollars.

In Auditor's office For postage, stationery and other necessary incidental expenses in the office of the Auditor of State, two hundred (200) dollars.

In Treasurer's office For postage, stationery and other necessary incidental expenses in the office of the Treasurer of State, two hundred (200) dollars.

In Attorney General's office For postage, stationery and other necessary incidental expenses in the office of the Attorney General, seventy-five (75) dollars.

Incidental expenses of Supreme Court For stationery and other necessary incidental expenses of the Supreme Court, two hundred (200) dollars, to be paid upon the certificate of the Chief Justice or any one of the Associate Justices.

In State Library For postage, express charges, stationery and other necessary incidental expenses in the State Library, one hundred (100) dollars.

For Commissioner of Statistics For postage, stationery and other necessary expenses incurred by the Commissioner of Statistics, one hundred (100) dollars.

For Adjutant General For postage and stationery in the office of the Adjutant General, forty (40) dollars.

For fuel &c for Legislature and State officers SEC. 4. For fuel and lights for both Houses of the Legislature, and for the several State offices, seven hundred (700) dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For shelter for ordnance SEC. 5. To provide shelter for the ordnance belonging to the State, seventy-five (75) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be paid upon certificate of the Adjutant General.

For distribution of laws SEC. 6. To aid and facilitate in the distribution of the Laws of the present session of the Legislature, one hundred (100) dollars, to be paid upon the certificate of the Secretary of State.

How paid SEC. 7. Any of the above appropriations may be paid out upon the certificate of the Governor except as otherwise provided in this Act.

SEC. 8. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXXVII.

An Act to regulate the Foreclosure of Real Estate.

- SECTION 1. Real estate may be redeemed within three years after sale.
2. Mortgagor entitled to possession, rents, &c., till expiration of time for redemption.
 3. Person may waive right of redemption.
 4. Act to take effect from and after passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of an act entitled "An Act to regulate the foreclosure of Real Estate," approved July twenty-ninth, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, be amended so that it shall read as follows, viz:

SEC. 1. That any real estate hereafter to be sold upon the execution, judgment, order or decree of any Court in this State, or upon the foreclosure by advertisement, or otherwise, of a mortgage, contract or liability, shall be held by the party purchasing the same subject to the right of the judgment debtor or mortgagor, or any one claiming through or under him or them, to redeem the same at any time within three years from the day of such sale, upon paying to the purchaser, mortgages or judgment creditor, the sum or amount for which the same was legally sold or foreclosed and interest thereon at the rate of seven per cent. per annum. Real estate sold on execution to be subject to redemption at any time within three years
