

CHAPTER VII.

An Act to authorize the Commissioners of Hennepin County to direct a portion of the tax assessed for County purposes to be collected in gold and silver, or current bank bills, for certain purposes.

- SECTION 1. Board of Commissioners empowered to direct a per centum of tax collected in gold or silver or current bank bills.
 2. Said per centum to be set apart for payment of interest on bonds or other indebtedness of County; balance how disposed of.
 3. When to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, until otherwise provided, is hereby authorized and empowered to order and direct that a portion of the tax assessed for county purposes for said county, not exceeding two mills on the dollar, shall be collected in gold or silver, or current bank bills, for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

Board of County Commissioners authorized to have a certain amount of tax collected in gold and silver or currency.

SEC. 2. That so much of the tax assessed for county purposes as is authorized to be collected in gold or silver or current bank bills in section one of this Act, or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the purpose, shall, upon the order of the Board of said County Commissioners, be directed to be set apart for the purpose of paying the interest or coupons on the bonds of said county, or on other indebtedness thereof, and the balance of said tax so ordered to be collected, after paying said interest or coupons, shall be disposed of in such manner as shall be ordered by the said Board of County Commissioners.

To be set apart for payment of coupons.

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.
