## CHAPTER LXXVIII.

An Act to authorize the town of Saint Cloud to levy a tax.

Section 1. Supervisors of the Town of St. Cloud authorized to levy a certain tax for the building of a Bridge.
Warrant to be issued to Town Collector. His duties and compensation:
When Act takes effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SEC. 1. That the Supervisors of the town of St. Cloud are hereby authorized to levy the tax voted by the electors of Tax for Bridge. said township for the building of a bridge therein, on the taxable property of said township, as found on the tax roll for said township, for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-nine.

SEC. 2. That said Supervisors, after assessing the tax voted as aforesaid, on the taxable property in said township, warrant to Town as found on the a4sessment roll of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, shall issue a warrant under their hands, directed to the Town Collector, directing him forthwith to collect said tax; and said Collector shall pay the tax so collected to the chairman of the Board of Town Supervisors, in thirty days from the date of said warrant; and he shall be subject to the same penalties, and have the same powers and compensation

as are provided for in the collection of the State and County tax.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER LXXIX.

An Act for the Division of the Town of Rushford, Fillmore County, and the Organization of the Town of Arendahl.

SECTION 1. Town of Arendahl set off from the Town of Rushford.
2. Town of Arendahl to elect officers.
3. When Act takes effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That town one hundred and four (104) north of Rushford. of range nine (9) west, be and the same hereby is set off from the Town of Rushford, Fillmore County, and made a town to be known as the Town of Arenhahl, having all the powers, privileges, immunities, duties and liabilities belonging by law to towns.

Sec. 2. The qualified electors of said Town of Arendahl shall meet at the house of Isaac Jackson, in said township, to elect officers on the first Tuesday of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, to elect the officers of said town and do such other business as may be legal and necessary for town purposes,
