

CHAPTER VIII.

An Act to legalize the proceedings of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Hennepin in establishing the towns of Champlin and Dayton, in said County.

SECTION 1. Establishment of Towns of Champlin and Dayton legalized.
2. When to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the acts and proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin in erecting and establishing the Towns of Champlin and Dayton, in said County, in the spring of eighteen hundred and fifty-eight (1858), and all acts and proceeding of the town meetings of the said towns of Champlin and Dayton, done in pursuance thereof, be, and the same are hereby declared to be in [all] respects legal and valid.

SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER IX.

An Act to establish the town of Eagan.

SECTION 1. Boundaries of the town.
2. First election of Township Officers, when and where.
3. Election how conducted.
4. When to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That town number twenty-seven (27), north

of range number twenty-three (23) west, in the County of Dakota, be, and the same is hereby erected into a separate town, to be known as the Town of Eagan.

SEC. 2. The first election for township officers shall be held at the house of Michael Conner, in said town, on the first Tuesday of April next; and it is hereby made the duty of the said Michael Conner to post up written notices of said election in three of the most public places in said town, at least ten days previous to the time of said election.

SEC. 3. The electors, when assembled in accordance with such notice, shall have and possess all the powers conferred on electors at the annual township election; and the said election shall be opened and conducted in all respects as the said annual township election; and the judges of said election shall issue certificates of election to the persons entitled to the same.

Duties of judges.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER X.

An Act to Legalize the Sale of Lands for Taxes in Carver County for the year A. D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, and one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

SECTION 1. Sales of lands for delinquent taxes of the year 1857 and 1858, legalized.
2. When to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all sales of lands for delinquent taxes made by the Treasurer of Carver County for the years one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven and one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, are hereby declared to be as
