dam shall have a complete lien upon said logs, timber or Proceedings lumber, until the said tolls shall have been paid. And against persons when said tolls so due, for sluicing logs, timber or lum-refusing to pay ber, shall not be paid on demand by the owner or owners thereof, the proprietor or proprietors of the dam through which the same shall have been sluiced, are hereby authorized and empowered to take and sell a sutficient quantity of the logs, timber or lumber, at public auction to pay the tolls so due; Provided, That written or printed notices of the sale shall be posted up at the office of the surveyor general of logs and lumber of the district, and at the seat of the county in which said property shall have been seized.

Sec. 8. This Act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LI.

An Act to Amend An Act Entitled An Act to Regulate the Traffic in Logs and Lumber, Approved August Ninth, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Eight, and to Repeal An Act Amendatory thereto, Approved January Fourteenth, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty.

SECTION 1. Establishment of six surveying districts.
2. Houndaries of the districts.
3. Locations of the offices of Surveyor Generals.
4. Repeal of former acts.
5. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of chapter one (1) of Establishment of an act entitled "an act to regulate the traffic in logs and six surveying dislumber," approved August ninth, one thousand eight tricts hundred and fifty-eight, be amended to read as follows:

There shall be and there are hereby created six districts for the purpose of survey and measurement of logs, lumber and timbers within this State.

SEC. 2. That section two (2), chapter one (1), of said

act be so amended as to read as follows:

The St. Croix Lake and River and their tributaries The Mississippi River shall constitute the first district. and its tributaries between the mouth of the St. Croix Lake and the mouth of Elk River, shall constitute the The Mississippi River and its tributaries second district. between the mouth of the St. Croix Lake and the outlet of Lake Pepin, shall constitute the third district. Mississippi River and its tributaries above the mouth of The Mis-Elk River shall constitute the fourth district. sissippi River and its tributaries below the outlet of Lake Pepin, shall constitute the fifth district. The Bay of Superior, Saint Louis Bay, Saint Louis River and their tributaries shall constitute the sixth district.

SEC. 3. That section four (4) of chapter one (1) of said

act be amended so as to read as follows:

The Surveyor General of the first district shall keep his office at the city of Stillwater; of the second district, at the Falls of St. Anthony; of the third district, at the city of Red Wing; of the fourth district, at Little Falls; of the fifth district, at the city of Wabashaw; of the sixth district, at Oneota.

SEC. 4. An act to amend an act entitled "an act to Repeal of former regulate the traffic in logs and lumber," approved January fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, is hereby repealed; Provided, however, that the repeal of said act shall not, nor shall any of the provisions of this Act affect the term of office of any surveyor or other officer heretofore elected for any of said districts,

or affect such office, but such officers shall continue to exercise the duties of their respective offices to all intents and purposes as though this Act had not passed

SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect and be in force in

thirty days from and after its passage. Approved March 7th, A. D. 1861.
