

CHAPTER LIV.

An Act to amend an act entitled an act to incorporate the City of Hastings, approved March 7th, A. D. 1857.

- SECTION 1. Western boundary line of the city of Hastings.
2. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Western bounda-
ry line of the city
of Hastings

SECTION 1. The western boundary of the city of Hastings shall be a line running north and south through the centre of sections numbers seventeen (17) and twenty (20) in township number one hundred and fifteen (115) north of range number seventeen (17) west of the fifth (5) principal meridian.

SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LV.

An Act to amend an act entitled "an act to amend the Charter of the City of Saint Paul."

- SECTION 1. Amendment to section 6, of the act approved February 25, 1860. To license and regulate exhibitions of caravans, circuses, etc.
2. Amendment to proviso of section 15. Election of Justices of the Peace and Constables—terms of office.
3. Act, when to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section six of the act entitled "an act to amend the charter of the city of Saint Paul," approved February twenty-fifth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 6. That sub-division first of section three (3) of chapter four (4) of said act of incorporation, be amended and shall read as follows :

First—To license and regulate the exhibitions of common showmen and shows of all kinds, and the exhibitions of caravans, circuses, concerts and theatrical performances ; to license and regulate billiard tables, nine or ten pin alleys, bowling saloons, and the traffic of all persons vending or dealing in spirituous or vinous liquors. To license and regulate exhibitions, etc.

Sec. 2. That the proviso to section fifteen of said "act to amend the charter of the city of Saint Paul," be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

Provided, That at the municipal election of said city, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-two, and every two years thereafter, there shall be elected one justice of the peace, and every year thereafter one constable in and for each ward, who shall be residents of the ward in and for which they may be elected, and that said justices of the peace shall hold their office for the term of two years, and said constable for the term of one year, and until their successors shall be elected and qualified, and the present justices of the peace in said city shall hold their offices until the election and qualification of their successors. The said justices of the peace shall have the same jurisdiction within the county of Ramsey as other justices of the peace now have by law or may hereafter have, and shall supersede all other justices of the peace within said city, except the city justice thereof, and said constables shall supersede all other constables therein ; and the said justices and constables hereafter to be elected, shall before entering upon the duties of their offices, take the oath and execute and file the bond prescribed by section one of chapter three of the charter of said city, and the said officers may be removed and vacancies filled in the manner prescribed by chapter two of said charter. Election of Justices of the Peace and Constables—term of office

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
