to collect the said poll tax, and that after diligent search when and for he has been unable to find any personal property upon what Treasurer which to distrain for any poll tax remaining unpaid upon to also cath his list. The said list shall then be filed in the county auditor's office, who shall inform the State Auditor the number of polls assessed in his county, the number paid, the number remaining unpaid, and the amount allowed as fees for collection.

SEC. 7. The State Auditor shall charge each county Duty of State with the amount of polls assessed, and credit the amount Auditor penalty paid him, the amount of fees, and the amount uncollectance of duty ed. Any officer failing to perform his duties as provided in this act, shall be guilty of misdemeanor, and liable to a fine of fifty dollars.

SEC. 8. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER IV.

An Act to Provide for the Assessment and Collection of a Tax for State Purposes.

Tax for the purpose of meeting the interest on State loan, under the act of March 18th, 1838; also on the war loan under act of Sept. 27th, 1862.
 Duty of the proper officers in the several countles of the State.
 When act to take effect,

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. There shall be levied on all the taxable property in the State of Minnesota, for the year one Tax for meeting thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, a tax of four loan; also on and a half mills upon the dollar, for the use of the State, the war loan including the sum to be used as a sinking fund and for the interest on the State debt, under the provisions of an act entitled "an act to authorize a loan of two hundred

and fifty thousand dollars, to defray the current expenses of the State," approved March thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight," and also including the interest on the war loan, under the provisions of an act entitled "an act to provide for the borrowing of money to defray the expenses growing out of the present Indian war," approved September twenty-seventh, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, two mills thereof shall be payable in gold and silver or in United States treasury notes. So much thereof, as may be necessary, shall be applied to the payment of the interest and expenses on the State loan of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and to the payment of the interest and expenses on the war loan of one hundred thousand dollars.

Duty of the proper officers

Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the proper officers of the several counties of the State to assess and collect said tax in their respective counties, and pay the same over to the Treesurer of State, in the manner and time prescribed by law.

SEO. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.

## CHAPTER V.
