

1st. The names of the persons concerned, and their having associated to form a body politic.

2d. Their corporate name and location or place of business.

3d. If a joint stock company, the amount of capital stock, and the amount constituting a share; if not a joint stock company then the terms of admission to membership, and the amount of monthly or yearly contributions required of the members.

4th. What officers the society or company will have, by what officers business will be conducted, and when they are to be elected, or if appointed, when and by whom such appointment is to be made, and also the number of trustees to manage the said society, and the names of the trustees for the first year of its existence, which articles shall be subscribed by them or by their President and Secretary, and a majority of such associates, and sworn to by two or more of such associates, before some officer authorized to administer oaths; and filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of the county where the corporation exists, and a duplicate thereof, shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State.

## CHAPTER LIX.

### *An Act to Establish the Price of Advertising for the State Departments.*

SECTION 1. Rates of advertising for State Departments.  
2. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That all advertising done for any of the

State departments, the price for which is not otherwise provided for by law, shall be paid for at the uniform rate of seventy-five cents per square, (which is declared to be equal to three hundred ems of the type in which the same is printed,) for the first insertion, and thirty seven 50-100 cents for each subsequent insertion.

*Rates of advertising for State Departments*

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER LX.

### *An Act for the Preservation of Fish.*

- SECTION 1.** Penalty for taking or catching fish in Lakes Calhoun and Harriet—time when.  
 2. Prosecutions how conducted.  
 3. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That if any person or persons shall spear, net, or in any way or manner, take or catch any fish in or from any or either of the outlets or inlets of Lakes Calhoun and Harriet, in the county of Hennepin, in said State, or the marshes and waters below the same, and above Richland Mills, in said county, between the first day of February and the fifteenth day of May, of each and every year, such person or persons shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in the sum of two dollars for each and every fish so speared, netted, or in any manner taken or caught as aforesaid, therefrom; and such person or persons shall stand committed to the county jail of said county, until such fine be paid.

*Penalty for catching fish at certain times*

SEC. 2. That all prosecutions under this act shall be commenced within one year from the time of the commission of any offence thereunder, and not afterwards,
