

Mileage and per diem of members of the Legislature

(\$12,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same hereby is appropriated, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the payment of the mileage, per diem, and stationery of the members, and the per diem and stationery of the officers of the present Legislature.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, January 20, 1863.

CHAPTER LXV.

An Act to appropriate Money for the Payment of Military Claims, incurred by the State of Minnesota, in the Sioux war.

SECTION 1. Appropriation for the purpose of paying the claims for services rendered and material furnished the State, for protecting the people against the Sioux Indians.

2. When act to take effect.

WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Minnesota, by an act approved September 22d, 1862, did appropriate the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars, for the payment of claims for military services in the late outbreak of the Sioux Indians; and

WHEREAS, The said sum has proved insufficient to pay the said claims, as adjusted and allowed by the several Boards of State Auditors, and that a further appropriation is necessary to meet these claims for services rendered for the protection of our people against said Indians; therefore

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That for the purpose of paying the claims for services rendered and material furnished the State of

Minnesota, in protecting our people against the Sioux Indians, as adjusted and allowed by the several Boards of State Auditors, constituted for that purpose by the Legislature, the sum of two hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury that may be received from any appropriation made by the Congress of the United States, to reimburse the State of Minnesota, for expenses incurred by the State in defending the people against the Sioux Indians. *Provided*, That no warrant shall be drawn by the State Auditor on the appropriation herein made, until there be money in the treasury from the United States, as aforesaid, to pay the same.

Appropriation for paying the claims for services rendered and materials furnished for protection against the Sioux Indians

And after the present Board of State Auditors shall have completed the adjustment of claims, the State Auditor, in case the money appropriated by the United States shall be insufficient to pay the whole amount of such claims which shall then be audited and unpaid, shall issue his warrants upon the Treasurer for the amount of such money *pro rata*, upon such audited claims.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
