

shall canvass said votes in the same manner that votes for town officers are canvassed, and the result of said ballot shall be transmitted to the County Auditor by the several town clerks by mail or otherwise within ten days' of said election.

SEC. 3. If upon receipt of the returns from the above mentioned towns, the County Auditor shall find that any four of said towns have voted for said tax, then the Auditor shall proceed to extend a tax of six mills on the dollar upon the assesment rolls of the towns voting said tax.

Duty of County Auditor

SEC. 4. The chairman of the board of supervisors of each of the several towns upon which said tax is assessed shall be a board of commissioners under whose direction the money raised by the provisions of this act shall be expended, and the County Treasurer is hereby required to pay over all moneys collected by the provisions of this act upon the order of a majority of said commissioners.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XLIX.

An Act to Authorize the Town of Plymouth, in Hennepin County, to Levy a Tax to pay a Bounty to Volunteers.

- SECTION 1. Duty of County Auditor.
 2. For what purpose tax assessed.
 3. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the County Auditor of Hennepin

county be, and is hereby authorized and directed to enter upon the tax duplicate of the town of Plymouth, Hennepin county, State of Minnesota, for the year A. D. 1863, a tax of four mills on each dollar of valuation.

For what purpose
tax assessed

SEC. 2. The above tax, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be applied in paying the amount ordered by said town as a bounty to volunteers under the call of the President of the United States for six hundred thousand volunteers in the year 1862, and the balance of the tax, if any, to be applied in payment of the current town expenses of said year.

SEC. 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, March 6, 1863.

CHAPTER L.

An Act for the Relief of certain Persons having Claims to the Town Site of Elk City.

- SECTION 1. Corporate authorities to give public notice of the entry of the town site—
 when.
 2. Time for filing claims extended.
 3. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the corporate authorities of the town of Elk City are hereby authorized and required within sixty days after the approval of this act, to give public notice of the entry of the town site of Elk City, in accordance with the provisions of section three of an act of the Legislative Assembly of the late Territory of Minnesota, entitled "an act prescribing rules and regulations for the execution of a trust arising under the act of Congress entitled 'an act for the relief of citizens of towns upon lands of the United States under certain
