## CHAPTER LII.

An Act to Locate a State Road from Garden City, in Blue Earth County, to Wilton, in Waseca County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Commissioners appointed

SECTION 1. John Dilley, J. K. Mead and H. D. Baldwin, are hereby appointed commissioners to locate a State road, commencing at Garden City, in Blue Earth county, thence running in an easterly direction across the Winnebago Reservation, to Wilton, in Waseca county.

missioners—to fill vacanojes

Said commissioners shall meet at Garden City, in the county of Blue Earth, at a time not later Meeting of com than the first day of August next, and proceed to the discharge of their duties under this act; and if from any cause any one of said commissioners appointed under this act, shall be unable to perform the duties imposed by this act, he shall have the power to appoint a substitute, who shall have the same authority, when so appointed, as one of the commissioners named in this act.

May employ assation

SEC. 3. Said commissioners are hereby authorized to employ in locating said road one chainman, one axeman and one surveyor; Provided, said commissioners, chaindistants—compen man and axeman shall not receive more than one dollar and fifty cents per day, nor the surveyor more than three dollars per day for their services under this act.

Expenses, how paid

SEC. 4. The expense of locating said road shall be paid by the counties through or in which said road may pass, in proportion to the distance it may run in each county.

It shall be the duty of such commissioners to SEc. 5. appraise the damages sustained by each owner of land

## CHAPTER LIII.

An Act to Legalize the Acts of the Commissioners appointed by an act of the Legislature, approved March the 6th, 1862, to locate a State Road from Mantorville to Red Wing.
