*A Memorial to the Post-Master General, for an Increase
of Mail Service from Osage, Iowa, to Owatonna, Min-
nesota.*

To the Post-Master General of the United States :

Your Memorialists, the Legislature of Minnesota, re-
spectfully represent:

That there is now a daily mail route in operation from
St. Paul to Owatonna, Minnesota, and from Dubuque to
Osage, Iowa; that Osage and Owatonna, being sixty
miles apart, and each being the terminus of a daily mail
route as aforesaid, and connected by a tri-weekly mail
only; that the convenience of the inhabitants living be-
tween said termini at East Mitchell, West Mitchell, St.
Ausgar, Newburgh, Otranto, Cedar City, Austin, Lan-
sing, Madison, Oak Glen, and Aurora, would be greatly
promoted by an increase of said tri-weekly to said dai-
ly service—for which your memorialists respectfully
pray.
