Resolved, By the Senate of Minnesota, (the House concurring therein) that his Excellency, Governor Ramsey, is hereby requested to communicate with the President and the Secretary of War, if he has not already done so, with the view, if possible, of securing a temporary withdrawal of said First Regiment to the State of Minnesota.

Resolved, further, That our Senators and Representatives at Washington, are hereby earnestly requested to co-operate in procuring the return of said Regiment, to this State, for the purposes aforesaid.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be transmitted by the Governor to each of our Senators and Representatives in Courses.
