and to file or record the same in the same manner and at the place required for the filing or recording of the original articles or certificates, and thenceforward the amendment so specified shall become a part of the said articles or certificates, with the same force and effect in every respect, from and after the time of such filing or recording, as if specified in the original articles or certificates, Provided, That no such amendment shall be made which might not have been in the origi- Proviso nal articles or certificates, under the general laws, authorizing the creation of such associations or corporations.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LIV.

An Act to prevent the importation, running at large, and sale of diseased sheep.

SECTION 1. Penalty for permitting diseased sheep to run at large.

- Nothing to prevent the recovery of damages for allowing diseased sheep to run at large.

Beitenacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That any person being the owner of sheep, or having the same in charge, who shall import or drive into this State, or shall turn out, or suffer to run at large upon any common, highway or unenclosed lands, any sheep having any contagious disease, or who shall sell, let or dispose of any such sheep, knowing the same to be so diseased, without first apprising the purchaser thereof, or person taking them, of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by fine in a sum not less than fifty dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars.
