

Thirteenth—For deficiency due J. C. Dixon, for time spent in traveling from home in Minnesota, to Vicksburg, from July 5th, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, to July 26th, at one hundred and twenty-one dollars per month, ninety-two dollars.

Appropriations for deficiencies

Fourteenth—For deficiency due J. C. Dixon, for traveling one thousand four hundred and thirty-nine miles, to the quarters of the Fifth Regiment of Minnesota volunteers, under order of Adjutant General Malmros, at six cents per mile, eighty-six dollars and thirty-four cents.

Fifteenth—For extra pay to A. Richardson, A. and M. S. K. for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, one hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXIV.

An Act appropriating money for the support of the State government for the year A. D. eighteen hundred and sixty-four, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. Appropriations from the interest fund.

1. For fuel and lights for both Houses of the Legislature, and the several State officers.
 2. For fuel, lights, etc. for the State Prison.
 3. For preparing cistern, and furnishing necessary hose for protection against fire.
 4. For building additional cells.
 5. For books to replenish library.
 6. For incidental printing.
 7. For printing and binding laws and journals.
 8. For printing, binding and advertising for the several State officers.
 9. For publication of laws in the official paper of the State.
 10. For printing the report of the Commissioners for revising the Statutes.
 11. For the support of indigent insane persons.
 12. To pay interest on State loan.
2. Appropriation for the education of the deaf and dumb, to be paid out of the State interest fund.
 3. When act to take effect.

Beit enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money, or

so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury belonging to the interest fund, after providing for the interest on the eight per cent. loan of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, due July 1, A. D. 1864, and January 1, A. D. 1865, and the interest on the war loan of one hundred thousand dollars, due May 1, and November 1, A. D. 1864, for expenditures in support of the State government for the year 1864, and for other purposes :

FUEL AND LIGHT.

First—For fuel and lights for both houses of the legislature, and for the several State officers, one thousand dollars.

STATE PRISON.

Second—For fuel and lights, additional bedding and clothing, groceries, provisions, repairs and other incidental expenses, four thousand dollars.

Third—For the repairs of cistern and furnishing necessary hose for protection against fire, five hundred dollars.

Fourth—For building additional cells, two thousand one hundred dollars.

Fifth—For books to replenish library, one hundred dollars.

PUBLIC PRINTING.

Sixth—For incidental printing for the legislature of 1864, two thousand dollars.

Seventh—For printing and binding three hundred copies of each of the journals of the Senate and House of Representatives, and the accompanying documents, and printing and binding five thousand copies of the laws of the present legislature, five thousand dollars.

Eighth—For printing, binding and advertising for the several State officers, four thousand eight hundred dollars.

Ninth—For publication of the laws in the official paper of the State, five hundred dollars.

Tenth—To Frederick Driscoll, for printing the report of the commissioners for revising the statutes, two thousand dollars.

SUPPORT OF INSANE.

Eleventh—For the support of indigent insane persons, subject to the order of the Governor, three thousand dollars.

SOLDIERS' VOTING.

Miscellaneous
appropriations

Twelfth—For the purchase of postage stamps and stationery for the use of the commissioners in obtaining the soldiers' votes for the year A. D. 1864, two hundred and fifty dollars.

INTEREST ON STATE LOAN.

Thirteenth—For the payment of interest and exchange on New York, on the eight per cent. loan of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and the seven per cent. war loan of one hundred thousand dollars, for the year A. D. 1864, twenty-seven thousand two hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. That four thousand one hundred dollars, appropriated to "Minnesota State Institution for the Education of the Deaf and Dumb," by act of February 13th, 1864, shall also be paid out of the State interest fund instead of revenue fund.

SEC. 3. This act to take effect from and after its passage.

Approved March 4, 1864.
