of this act, sufficient to pay all expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this act. The town clerk shall, on or before the first day of September in each year, file with the county auditor a certified copy of the record of such vote, and thereupon such tax shall be levied and collected as other town taxes are levied and collected.

SEC. 15. The township assessor of the town of Lake City shall make a separate list of the persons and personal property of all persons residing within the district of country described in section three of this act, in the same manner as he is now required to do by chapter five of the session laws, passed at the extra session of 1862, in case of residents of any incorporated town.

SEC. 16. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER XIII.

## An Act to amend an act entitled "An act for the support and better regulation of Common Schools in the City of Saint Anthony."

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section six, of Chapter forty. Board of Education to establish Primary Schools, Grammar Schools and Central High Schools--what numberwhen.

9. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That section six, of chapter forty, of the session laws of 1860, be amended, so as to read as follows:

Duty of town as-

Section 6. It shall be the duty of said board of education, as soon as they may realize sufficient funds for the purpose, to establish within the bounds of the city corporation of Saint Anthony, four or more primary schools, to be located in different parts of the city, so as best to accommodate the inhabitants, in which the rudiments of an English education may be taught. It shall be the further duty of said board to establish two or more grammar schools, to be located in different parts of the city, so as best to accommo- Roard of Educadate the inhabitants, where instructions shall be given what in the various studies not provided for in the primary sumber-when schools, and yet requisite to a respectable English education. And it shall be the further duty of said board to establish a central high school, where instruction in the higher English branches shall be given. To each school in this system there shall be gratuitous admission for the children, wards and apprentices of all residents of the corporate city of St. Anthony, with the following restrictions, namely:

No pupil shall be admitted to the grammar school who fails to sustain a thorough examination in the studies in the primary school, and no pupil shall be admitted to the high school who fails to sustain a thorough examination in the studies of the grammar school, and the teacher shall have power in either school, with the advice and direction of the board of education, to exclude for misconduct in extreme cases, and to classify the pupils, as the best good of the school shall seem to require.

This act shall be in force from and after SEC. 2. its passage.
