Said bonds when issued, and the interest SEC. 2. thereon accruing, shall be and remain a legal and subsisting demand against said counties respectively, till the same are paid or redeemed, according to the true intent and meaning thereof: Provided, That they are issued for sums of not less than one hundred dollars, nor more than one thousand dollars each, stating on their face the object for which they are issued, signed by the chairman of the board of county commissioners, and attested by the auditor of the county: And provided, That no more bonds shall be issued than may be found necessary for the purposes named in the first section of this act, and that in no event shall either county aforesaid exceed in the aggregate of its issues for the purposes aforesaid, the said sum of ten thousand dollars: Provided, however, that no bonds shall be issued under the provisions of this act by either of the counties named in this act, before the question is first submitted to a vote of the people of the county, whose commissioners may propose to make such an issue of bonds, for which purpose said commissioners are authorized to submit the question to the people of the county at the next annual election, in such manner as they may direct; and if at such election, a majority of the voters should favor such an issue of bonds, then the commissioners of such county may issue the bonds authorized by this act; but if a majority of the votes should be against such an issue, then no bonds shall be issued by such county, under the provisions of this act.

It shall be the duty of said commissioners (of Ramsey and Hennepin,) a majority of each of them concurring, after the passage of this act, to locate and Dutle of committo advertise for plans and proposals for the building of said bridge, and shall let the contract for the same on such terms and conditions as they may deem most conducive to the public welfare, and best calculated in their judgment to expedite the completion of the work.
