Repeals portion
of original act.

SEC. 3. The said regents are hereby empowered and authorized in their discretion, if by them deemed necessary for the interests of the University, to borrow ten thousand dollars in anticipation of, and to be repaid from the proceeds of the sales of the lands aforesaid.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XII.

March 2, 1866.

An Act to provide for the erection of cells in the State Prison at Stillwater.

- SECTION 1. Warden of State Prison to have cells constructed in said building, and how to be built.
2. Plan and estimate to be approved by Board of Inspectors and Governor. Also provides the manner in which the contract shall be awarded.
 3. Fixes the amount to be expended for the work, and how raised.
 4. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Cells to be erected in State Prison

SECTION 1. The warden of the State Prison, with the concurrence of the board of inspectors is hereby authorized to cause to be erected forty-two cells within the new cell building in the State Prison—said cells to be built with stone, brick and iron, in the most substantial manner, and in size to conform to the original plan of the building.

Plans and estimates to be prepared.

SEC. 2. The warden shall cause to be prepared a plan and estimate for said cells, which shall be

approved by the board of inspectors and the Governor. He shall also advertise in a newspaper published at Stillwater, also in one newspaper in the city of St. Paul, for four weeks, for sealed proposals for furnishing the materials and doing the work, and he shall, with the board of inspectors, award the contract for such material and labor herein provided for, to the best responsible bidder, who will give the necessary security for the faithful performance of said contract.

Contracts to be advertised for.

The warden may provide that said work and material may be paid for in instalments as the work progresses, always reserving ten per cent. of the contract price until the full completion of said work according to the contract.

SEC. 3. The sum of eight thousand (8,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act.

Appropriates money.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
