55th. For the incidental expenses of the State Historical Society, five hundred dollars.

56th. For this State's proportion of expenses for national cemeteries, twelve hundred and fifty dollars.

57th. The sum of five thousand dollars is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, in addition to that already appropriated for the erection of a building for the ac-

commodation and education of the deaf, dumb and blind. Provided, that the said sum of five thousand dollars shall be paid from the receipts of the treasury during the year one thousand eight hundred and sixtyseven.

SEC. 24. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
