SEC. 6. *And be it further enacted,* That the county commissioners of Winona county are hereby empowered to levy a tax on the taxable property of said county, to defray the expense of re-locating, establishing, opening and working said section of said road, not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars.

SEC. 7. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CVI.

March 1, 1866.

An Act to provide for surveying, locating and establishing a State Road from Minneapolis, in Hennepin county, to Monticello, in Wright county.

SECTION 1. Provides for State Road in Hennepin and Rice counties, and nominates commissioners to carry it out.

3. Duty of commissioners.
4. May hire Surveyor, &c., compensation.
5. How damages to be paid.
6. Plat to be filed.
7. How expenses of said location to be defrayed.
8. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Nominates Com-
missioners.

SECTION 1. That Cyrus Aldrich and H. H. Hopkins, of Hennepin county, and D. R. Farnham, of Wright county, are hereby appointed commissioners, to survey, locate and establish a State Road, commencing at Minneapolis, in Hennepin county, and running thence by the way of P. B. Corcorn's store, in the

town of Corcorn, thence to a crossing at Crow River, on the west line of the south west quarter of section ten, of town one hundred and nineteen, of range twenty-four, thence to the north east quarter of section five, of town one hundred and nineteen, of range twenty-four, thence to the east end of Lake Beebee, thence to the west end of Lake Pelican, and thence to Monticello, in Wright county. *Provided, however,* That if it is considered best by the said commissioners or a majority of them, they may deviate the said survey, location and establishment of the said road in so far as the above named intermediate points are concerned.

SEC. 2. If any of the said commissioners shall, from any cause, fail or be unable to perform the duties prescribed by this act, he shall have the power to appoint substitutes. May appoint substitute.

SEC. 3. It shall be the duty of said commissioners, and they or a majority of them, shall have the power to meet at Minneapolis, aforesaid, on the first Monday of March next, or as soon thereafter as practicable, and proceed to the discharge of their duties under and carry out the provisions and objects of this act. Duties of Commissioners.

SEC. 4. The said commissioners are hereby authorized to employ in discharging their duties under this act, one chainman, one axeman and one surveyor. *Provided,* That said commissioners, axeman and chainman shall not receive more than two dollars and fifty cents per day each, nor the surveyor more than five dollars per day for such services. Officers—their Compensation.

SEC. 5. Any damages sustained by reason of laying out and opening of said road shall be assessed and determined by said commissioners, and shall be paid by the county in which said damages shall be so assessed. Damages—How assessed.

SEC. 6. Said commissioners shall cause an accurate plat and map of the survey and location of said road to be made, which, together with a statement of their appraisal of damages, shall be filed in the office of the county auditor, in each of said counties, and thereupon the establishment of said road shall be deemed complete, and the supervisors of the several towns through which said road shall pass shall cause to be opened and worked so much of said road as lies within their respective towns, upon being notified by the Plat to be filed.

How expenses to be paid.

SEC. 7. The expenses of surveying, locating and establishing said road shall be paid by the counties through or in which said road shall run, in proportion to the distance it shall run in said county.

SEC. 8. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER OVIL.

February 23, 1866 *An Act to locate a State Road from Watertown, in Carver County, to Preston Lake.*

- SECTION 1. Nominates certain parties to locate road.
2. Where and when Commissioners to meet.
 3. How vacancies to be filled.
 4. Commissioners to appoint Surveyor, &c.
 5. Commissioners to file plat.
 6. Damages to be appraised by Commissioners.
 7. How expenses to be defrayed.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Commissioners to be appointed.

SECTION 1. That J. A. O. Flood, T. H. Pendergast and David Alway are hereby appointed commissioners to locate and establish a State road from Watertown, in Carver county, by way of Hutchinson, in McLeod county, to Lake Preston in township No. 115 north, of range No. 31 west.

Place of meeting.

SEC. 2. The said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall meet at Hutchinson, in McLeod county, on the third Monday in May next, and proceed to discharge their duties according to the provisions of this act.
