GENERAL LAWS

MINNESOTA

PASSED AND APPROVED DURING THE NINTH SESSION OF THE STATE LEGISLATURE, COMMENCING JANUARY EIGHTH, ONE THOUS-AND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN, AND TERMINATING MARCH EIGHTH, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY SEVEN.

CHAPTER I.

An act to promote education.

March 9, 1867

Section 1,-Gives permission to School Trustees of School Districts to have pupils taught foreign languages.

2.-When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the trustees of any school district, Power of trustees or the board of education of any city, town, or organized school district in this state, may provide for the instruction of the pupils of the common schools in their district, or such as may desire it, in any of the foreign languages, for one hour each day; Provided, that the teacher of such school is competent to give such instruction, or a proper instructor for such purpose can be obtained.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
