

CHAPTER XVI.

An Act to amend sections forty-five and forty-seven of chapter thirty-four of the General Statutes, relating to corporations.

March 6, 1867

SECTION 1—Amends certain sections of chapter thirty-four of general statutes.
2—When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Section forty-seven of chapter thirty-four of the general statutes is hereby amended by inserting between the words "of" and "fifty," in the third line of said section, the following words, "not less than ten dollars nor more than."

Amendment

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XVII:

An Act to amend chapter thirty-four of the General Statutes of Minnesota, relating to corporations.

March 9, 1867

SECTION 1—Amends section 85 of chapter 34, of general statutes, by giving power to religious corporation to sell or otherwise dispose of real estate.
2—When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section eighty-five of chapter thirty-four of the general statutes of Minnesota, relating to corporations, be amended so as to read as follows, (viz:)

Religious corporations

Section 85. It shall be lawful for any religious corporation, organized under the provisions of this title, by and through their trustees to sell and convey, encumber or otherwise dispose of any real estate belonging to such corporation: *Provided, however,* That no such conveyance or encumbrance shall be made by the trustees except when first authorized to make the same by a resolution of such society, passed at a meeting thereof called for that purpose, notice of the time, place and object of which shall be given for at least four successive Sabbaths on which such society stately meet for public worship immediately preceding the time specified for such meeting; and proof of the facts of such notice, meetings, and resolutions may be made by the affidavits of one of such trustees or by any of the members of such society cognizant of the facts. Such affidavits may be recorded at length in the office of the register of deeds of the county where the premises are situated and the same and the records thereof aforesaid, or certified copies of such records, shall be presumptive evidence of the facts therein contained.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
