

CHAPTER CXXVIII.

February 11, '67

An Act to change a township road laid out according to law, on the 10th day of Dec., A. D. 1866, in the town of Greenfield, Wabasha county, Minnesota, from four rods wide to two rods wide.

SECTION 1.—Changes width of road.

2.—When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Change of road

SECTION 1. That the town road in the town of Greenfield, Wabasha county, Minnesota, which was laid out according to law by the supervisors of said town as appears by an order signed by them on the 10th day of December, A. D. 1866, and duly recorded by the clerk of said town; said road commencing near the house of Daniel Metzgar, in the public road at the quarter section line running east and west of section 30, town 110 north, of range 10 west, running due east along said quarter section line on through lands of I. F. Rose, — Keeney, G. A. Cook, Wm. Albertson, Oliver W. Collier, Levi Cook, F. J. Collier, Mrs. Dove, S. A. Kemp and Henry Grainer; thence north through lands of Henry Grainer and G. H. Freye until it intersects the public road now existing, be and the same is hereby changed from four rods wide to two rods wide, but in all other respects the said road shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be in every other respect a township road, subject to and to be controlled by law as other township roads are controlled, and as though the same were and had remained four rods wide.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
