

CHAPTER CXXXI

An Act to provide for the location of a state road from Anoka, in Anoka county to Princeton, in Mille Lac county. March 6, 1867.

SECTION 1.—Nominates commissioners.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That James McCann, J. F. Clark and Samuel Ross are hereby appointed commissioners to locate, survey and establish a state road from Anoka, in Anoka county, via Spencer Valley in Sherburne county, to Princeton in Mille Lac county. Commissioners

SEC. 2. The commissioners shall meet at Anoka on any day subsequent to the passage of this act and proceed to discharge their duties under this act, and if any one of said commissioners appointed under this act, shall be unable from any cause to perform the duties imposed by this act, he shall have power to appoint a substitute, who shall have the same authority, when so appointed, as one of the commissioners named in this act. Organization

SEC. 3. Said commissioners are hereby authorized to employ in locating said road, two chainmen, one axman and one surveyor: *Provided*, Said commissioners, chainmen and axman shall not receive more than two dollars and fifty cents per day, nor the surveyor more than four dollars per day for service rendered by virtue of this act. May employ assistants

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of such commissioners

to appraise the damages sustained by each owner of land through which said road may pass, and in case any one shall feel himself aggrieved by such appraisal he may appeal to the county commissioners of his county at any time within thirty days after filing of the plat of said road, as hereinafter provided in this act, and the said county commissioners shall at their next meeting after such appeal shall have been taken, proceed to hear and determine said appeal as they may deem just: *Provided*, That in all cases where the said road shall pass through lands owned by non-residents of the town, county or state, that the said commissioners appointed by this act shall duly appraise the damage to said land sustained by reason of the laying out of the road described in this act, and a full description of the road as laid out by said commissioners running through such land described as above, together with the appraisal of the commissioners thereon, shall be published in some newspaper published in one of said counties at least once each week for four successive weeks before the said road shall be deemed to be established, and such non-resident, if aggrieved, shall have thirty days to appeal from the decision of such commissioners after the expiration of the publication of the notice aforesaid such appeal to be taken to the county commissioners in the same manner as prescribed by this section for resident land owners.

Plat to be filed

SEC. 5. Said commissioners shall on or before the first day of September next, file an accurate map and plat of said road in the town clerk's office of each of the towns through which said road may run and also in the office of the register of deeds, in the county of Anoka and thereafter said road shall be deemed established.

Duty of board

SEC. 6. After the filing of the plat as provided for in the fifth section of this act, and the determination of appeals if any, it shall be the duty of the board of supervisors and road overseers of the towns through which said road may run, to open and work the same in the same manner as other roads are worked in said town.

SEC. 7. After the establishment of said road as provided in this act, neither the county commissioners of

the several counties, or the town supervisors of the several towns through which or in which said road may pass, shall have power to discontinue said road for the term of three years. Road not to be discontinued

SEC. 8. The expense of laying out and locating said road shall be paid by each of the counties through or in which said road may pass, in proportion to the distance it may run in each county. Expense

SEC. 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CXXXII.

An Act act to locate a state road from Millersburgh, in the county of Rice, to the town of Lanesburgh, in the county of Le Sueur. March 9, 1867.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That A. K. Maynard, John W. Thompson and Thomas Lambert are hereby appointed commissioners to locate a state road, commencing at Millersburgh in the county of Rice, near the quarter stake between sections ten and fifteen, township 111, range 21, running west nearly half a mile; thence north about a quarter of a mile; thence a little north of Nominates commissioners
