

taxable property of said county of Benton, equal to the amount of principal and interest maturing next after such levy, which taxes shall be collected as other county taxes are, and shall be paid in money, and shall constitute a fund for the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER LXIX.

February 13 '67

*An Act to authorize the county of Blue Earth to issue bonds for the erection of a jail.*

SECTION 1.—Commissioners authorized to issue bonds for jail—limits amount.

2.—How bonds to be signed.

3.—Rate of interest.

4.—Proper authorities may levy tax.

5.—Electors to determine location of jail.

6.—Duty of county commissioners.

7.—When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota*

Commissioners—  
may issue bonds

SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Blue Earth county are authorized to issue bonds for the purpose of building a jail in said county, the total sum not to exceed ten thousand dollars.

How signed

SEC. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the chairman of the county commissioners, attested by the county auditor, who shall keep a record of the same, and shall be issued in such amounts, at such times, and to such persons as the said county commissioners shall determine.

SEC. 3. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding twelve per cent. per annum, and shall be made payable in one, two or three years, as the said county commissioners shall determine.

Rate of interest

SEC. 4. The proper authorities shall annually levy a tax sufficient to pay the interest and principal that may become due on said bonds within the succeeding year, which tax shall be levied and collected in the same manner as state and county taxes are required to be levied and collected.

Authorities to levy tax

SEC. 5. At the next annual election, to be held in the county of Blue Earth on the first Tuesday of April, A. D. 1867, the electors of said county shall by vote determine the location of said jail. The ballots shall have the name of the village each elector may desire to designate either written or printed thereon, and shall be deposited in a separate box to be provided by the town supervisors, and the same qualifications shall be required of the persons voting, and the same rules shall govern the canvass of said votes as at such regular annual election of town officers.

Location of jail—how determined

SEC. 6. It shall be the duty of the county commissioners to locate and erect said jail within the limits of the village which shall at such election be designated by a plurality of the votes cast at such election.

County Commissioners to locate Jail

SEC. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
