April next the county treasurer of said county shall return to the auditor of said county a list of all lands Duty of treasurin said county upon which the taxes of the year one er and andltor thousand eight hundred and sixty-six shall remain unpaid, and the auditor of said county shall cause said list (with a notice attached thereto as required by law) to be published for four weeks successively prior to the first Monday in June next, in a newspaper published at Saint Cloud, in the county of Stearns.

SEC. 5. That the delinquent tax sale for the taxes when tax sale of the year eighteen hundred [and] sixty-six shall be held held at the office of the county auditor of said county at the time and in the manner provided by law.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXXIII.

An Act to legalize certain acts of the county officers of Pope county and authorize said officers to keep their 48, 1887 several offices at the town of Glenwood, in said county.

SECTION 1.—Legalizes action of retaining office.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the acts of the county officers of Pope county in keeping their several offices at Glen- Legalizes action wood, in said county, are hereby legalized and made valid.

That the county officers of Pope county are hereby authorized to keep their several offices at May retain office Glenwood, in said county, until the county seat thereof is permanently established according to law, not

exceeding two years from and after the passage of this act.

SECTION 1. That there is hereby established in the county of Ramsey, a court which is hereby constituted a court of record, by the name of the Court of Common Pleas of the county of Ramsey, which shall have equal and concurrent jurisdiction with the district court of
