CHAPTER XXXI.

March 4, 1868. An Act to amend section eighty-four, of chapter eleven of the General Statutes, relating to taxes.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section 34, Chapter 11, of the General Statutes. Decision binding.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section 84, of chapter 11, of the general statutes of Minnesota be amended by adding at the end of said section the following words: "and such decision shall be binding until annulled by the judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction."

CHAPTER XXXII.

March 6, 1868.

An Act to amend section one hundred and thirty-two, of chapter eleven, of the General Statutes, relating to redemption of lands.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section 132, Chapter 11, of the General Statutes. What to be evidence of redemption of lands.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one hundred and thirty-two

Decision binding. (132), of chapter eleven (11), of the general statutes, be and the same is hereby amended so that the last paragraph of said section shall read as follows:

"And upon payment into the county treasury of such sum or amount subsequent taxes, interest and charges Evidence of retogether with the sum of twenty-five cents for each certificate as treasurers fee; such certificate so given by said auditor shall be the evidence of the redemption of said lands.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from When act to take effect.

CHAPTER XXXIII.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section 180, Chapter 11, of the General Statutes. Time of redemption, two years.

2. When set to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one hundred and thirty, of chapter eleven, of the general statutes, be and is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 130. Lands and town lots sold or forfeited to the state as aforesaid, may be redeemed at any time within two years after the day of sale or forfeiture, and all lands or Time of relots belonging to minors, femmes covert or insane persons, demption, two or persons in captivity, sold or forfeited for taxes as aforesa id, may be redeemed at any time and during the continuance of such disability, or within two years after the removal of such disability.
