

By whom certificates issued
—duty of State Auditor.

for mileage and per diem to the presiding officers, and members of their respective houses, and certificates for per diem to the officers of the same, as provided for by this act; upon the presentation of such certificate, signed by the presiding officer and clerk, of the house to which the member, or officer, presenting the same belongs, to the state auditor, he shall issue his warrant upon the treasurer for the sum therein named, which amount shall be paid on presentation, out of any money in the treasury appropriated for that purpose.

Repeal of inconsistent acts.

SEC. 4. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

When act to take effect.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XLIV.

March 3, 1868.

An Act to amend Section Eight of Chapter Twenty-Six of the General Statutes, relating to Notaries Public.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section 8, Chapter 26, of the General Statutes. Protest of notes and bills—how limited.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section eight of chapter twenty-six of the general statutes, be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 8. Every notary public, when any bill of exchange or promissory note is by him protested for non-acceptance or non-payment, shall give notice thereof in writing to each party protested against, immediately after such protest is made, and such notice may in all cases be given by depositing the same in the post office, postage paid, and directed to the party protested against, at his

reputed place of residence, and the notary shall in such instrument of protest, certify to the time and manner of service of such notice upon the several parties protested against, and shall make a record of such instrument of protest in his official register, which record or a duly certified copy thereof shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts therein contained.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XLV.

An Act to amend Section Three (3), of Chapter Nine (9), of the General Statutes, relating to resignations, vacancies and removals. February 4, 1868

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section 3, Chapter 9, General Statutes. Add "Auditor" after "Coroner."

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section three (3), of chapter nine (9), of the general statutes, be and the same is hereby amended by adding the word "auditor" after "coroner," in the second line of aforesaid section.

Addition to said section.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
