corded in the office of the register of deeds of each county through which the road mortgaged or deeded may run, or wherever it may hold lands, and shall be notice to all the world of the rights of all parties under the same, and for this purpose and to secure the right of mortgagees or parties interested under deeds of trust so executed and recorded, the rolling stock and personal property of the company, properly belonging to the road and appertaining thereto shall be deemed a part of the road, and said mortgages and deeds so recorded, shall have the same effect both as to notice and otherwise, as to the personal, as to the real estate covered by them.

CHAPTER LVII.

March 5, 1868.

An Act for the protection of railroads and persons riding thereon.

- SECTION 1. Penalty for placing obstructions upon or in any way injure any railroad wilfully and maliciously.
2. Penalty for wilfully obstructing engine or carriage upon any railroad.
 3. Penalty for aiding or assisting in obstructing any railroad.
 4. Previous liabilities not to be affected by the passage of this act.
 5. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Penalty for ob-
structing rail-
roads.

SECTION 1. Whoever shall wilfully and maliciously obstruct the passage of any carriage upon any railroad, or in any way injure such road or anything appertaining thereto, or any materials or implements for the construction and use thereof, and whoever shall be aiding and abetting in such trespass, shall forfeit to the use of the

corporation for every such offence treble the amount of the damages which shall appear on the trial to have been sustained thereby.

SEC. 2. Whoever shall wilfully obstruct any engine or carriage passing upon any railroad, so as to endanger the safety of persons conveyed in or upon the same, or shall assist or aid therein, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison not exceeding twenty years.

Penalty for obstructing engine or carriage.

SEC. 3. Whoever shall wilfully do or cause to be done anything with intent to obstruct any engine or carriage passing upon any railroad, or with intent to endanger the safety of persons conveyed in or upon the same, or whoever shall aid or assist therein, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state's prison not more than five years, or by fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, nor less than one hundred dollars, and by imprisonment in the county jail not more than one year nor less than three months.

Penalty for aiding and assisting in obstructing railroad.

SEC. 4. No liabilities already incurred or proceedings pending, shall be affected by the passage of this act.

Prior liabilities not to be affected by this act.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LVIII.

An Act limiting the time of absence from a Homestead by the claimant thereof. March 6, 1868.
