her full authority to alien, sell and convey and dispose of her lands without the interference of her husband. And the court may grant such decree whenever it shall appear just or expedient, and thereupon the wife shall have full control of her real estate, with power to convey the same without her husband joining in the conveyance and as fully as if she were unmarried, or the court may by such decree make such limitations upon the power to convey such real estate as it may seem meet. A certified copy of such decree may be recorded in the deed records in the office of the register of deeds of any county wherein such lands may lie.

An Act to amend Section twenty-nine, of Chapter sixty-six of the General Statutes, relative to parties to civil actions.

Section 1. Amendment to Section twenty-nine (29) of Chapter sixty-six (66) of the General Statutes. A married woman may sue or be sued without joining her busband.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section twenty-nine, of chapter sixty-six, of the general statutes, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Married women may sue without joining with husbands.

Sec. 29. A married woman may sue or be sued as if unmarried, and without joining her husband, in all cases where the husband would not be a necessary party aside from the marriage relation.
