Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury

belonging to the general revenue fund, for the payment of the salaries of the officers of the state government for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

First—For the salary of the governor, three thousand

dollars (\$3,000.)

Second—For the salary of secretary of state and superintendent of public printing, eighteen hundred dollars (\$1,800.)

Third—For the salary of auditor of state, fifteen hundred

dollars (\$1,500.)

Fourth—For the salary of the treasurer of state, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

Fifth-For the salary of the attorney general, one Appropriations

thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

Sixth—For the salary of the superintendent of public instruction, twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500.)

Seventh—For the salary of the adjutant general, fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.)

Eighth—For the salary of the land commissioner, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

Ninth—For the salary of the librarian, eight hundred dollars (\$800)

Tenth—For the salary of the night watchman, six hundred dollars (\$600.)

Eleventh—For the salary of the janitor, eight hundred dollars (\$800.)

Twelfth-For the salary of the governor's private secretary, fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.)

Thirteenth—For the salary of the assistant secretary of state, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

Fourteenth—For the salary of the chief clerk of the state auditor, fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.)

Fifteenth—For the salary of the land clerk, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

Sixteenth - For the salary of the deputy treasurer, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

Seventeenth-For the salary of the clerk of the superintendent of public instruction, twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200.)

Eighteenth—For the salary of the clerk of the attorney

general, two hundred dollars (\$200.)

Nineteenth-For the salaries of the judges of the supreme and district courts and judge of the court of common pleas, thirty-four thousand dollars (\$34,000.)

or salaries of

Twentieth—For the salary of the clerk of the supreme court, eight hundred dollars (\$800.)

Twenty-first—For the salary of the reporter of the su-

preme court, six hundred dollars (\$600.)

Iwenty-second—For the payment of per diem, mileage and incidental expenses of officers and members of the twelfth session of the legislature, including all sums ordered paid by either or both houses thereof, the sum of five thousand dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary.

CHAPTER CXIV.

March 4, 1870. An Act to appropriate money for the salary of the Clerk of the Adjutant General.

SECTION 1. Appropriation for salary of Clerk in the Adjutant General's office.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury belonging to the general revenue fund, not otherwise appropriated, to Hugo Petzold, for salary as clerk in the adjutant general's office, from January first to March fifteenth, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.
