

## CHAPTER XIX.

March 5, 1870. *An Act to equalize Railroad Tariffs and regulate Elevator Charges.*

- SECTION 1. Not lawful for railroad companies or agents to collect elevator charges from persons shipping grain from private warehouses.
2. When act to take effect.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. It shall not be lawful for any railroad company or any agent or employee of any railroad company to charge or collect from any person or persons, elevator charges or any charges whatever for handling wheat, or for the use of any elevator in any case where grain is shipped on such road without being placed in or passed through such elevator, nor shall any company or any agent or employee thereof make any distinction whatever in charges against any person or persons shipping grain from private warehouses or handling grain otherwise than in or through elevators belonging to any railroad company.

*Illegal for railroad companies to collect elevator charges on grain shipped from private warehouses.*

*When act to take effect.*

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of May next.
