How expense of locating road to be defrayed.

SEC. 4. The expense of locating said road shall be paid by the counties through or in which said road may pass, in proportion to the distance it may run in each county.

Surveyor to file plat of road.

SEC. 5. At each end, and at every angle of the line of said road, a good and substantial stake shall be set, and a profile of said road shall be made by the surveyor, and shall be filed in the office of the register of deeds of each county through and in which the said road shall pass, on or before the first day of September next. And the said profile of said road or of any part of said road with the proper notes as to courses and distances attached, shall be prima facie evidence of the correctness of the same and of the legal existence of so much of said road as the said profile represents.

An Act to establish a State Road from Princeton, in Mille Lacs County, to a point between the towns of Monticello and Clear Water, in Wright County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That J. L. Carter, C. H. Chadbourne and Henry C. Fridley, are hereby appointed commissioners to

lay out and establish a state road from Princeton, in Mille Commissioners Lacs county, via Pleasant Valley Station, in Sherburne cate a state road. county, to a point to be by them selected, on the main road between the towns of Monticello and Clear Water, in Wright county.

SEC. 2.
