GENERAL LAWS

OF

MINNESOTA.

PASSED AND APPROVED AT THE THIRTEENTH SESSION OF THE STATE LEGISLATURE, COMMENCING JANUARY THIRD, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE, AND TERMINATING MARCH THIRD, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

CHAPTER I.

An Act to amend Section nineteen of Chapter thirty-six of the General Statutes, relating to the duties of school March 6, 1871. district clerks; and an act amendatory thereof, approved March first, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

- Amendment to Section Nineteen (19), Chapter Thirty-Six (36), General Явстюя 1. Statutes. When Olerk to make report to County Superintendent-report to contain-
 - 1. The names of all persons between the ages of five and twenty-one.
 - 2. The number attending school. .
 - 3. Length of time school taught, and amount of wages paid.
 - 4. The amount of apportionment fund received.
 - 5. The 'amount of money raised by tax-the purpose for which taxes were levied, etc.
 - 2. When not to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Section nineteen, of chapter thirty-six, of the general statutes, relating to the duties of school disз

trict clerks, and an act amendatory thereof, approved March first, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, are hereby amended so that said section nineteen shall read as follows:

Sec. 19. The clerk of each school district shall, on or before the tenth day of October in each year, make and transmit to the county superintendent a report in writing, showing,

First. The names of all persons, male and female, respectively, between the ages of five and twenty-one years, residing in his district, on the last day of September preceding the date of such report.

Second. The number who have attended school within the year.

Third. The length of time a school has been taught by a qualified teacher, and the amount of wages paid to teachers within the year.

Fourth. The amount received from the county treasurer within the year of money appropriated by the county auditor.

Fifth. The amounts received from the county treasurer arising from district taxes collected, the purposes for which such taxes were levied; the manner in which said sums have been expended; the condition of school houses and grounds; the text books used, and such other facts as the superintendent of public instruction may require; which report shall be verified by the oath of the clerk, which may be administered by any officer authorized to administer oaths, or by the county superintendent, who is hereby authorized to administer the same in such cases. SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
