## CHAPTER XVI.

March 4, 1871.

An Act to amend Section one hundred and twenty-eight, of Chapter eleven, of the General Statutes, relating to Taxes.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section one hundred and twenty-eight, (128), Chapter eleven
(11), General Statutes. Certificate may be assigned—when deemed to be
yold.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That section one hundred and twenty-eight, of chapter eleven, of the general statutes, be amended so as to read as follows:

Certificates may be assigned when deemed to be word, Sec. 128. Said certificate of purchase shall be assignable in law, and an assignment thereof shall vest in the assignee, or his legal representatives, all the right and title of the original purchaser. If at any time thereafter, either before or after the expiration of the period of redemption, the holder and owner of such certificate shall deliver the same to the county auditor to be cancelled, the auditor shall make an entry in the same book which contains the record of the sale, and opposite to the original description, that said certificate is cancelled together with the date of such cancellation, and thereupon said certificate shall become void, and such entry shall discharge and release the property described in said certificate from the operation and effect of such sale.

When not to take effect.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
