CHAPTER XLVIII.

An Act to prohibit the sale of spirituous and other liquors March 6, 1871. near the line of the Northern Pacific railroad during the construction thereof.

SECTION 1. Penalty for disposing of liquors of any kind-within what distance-in what num.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That if any person shall sell, exchange, barter or dispose of any spirituous, vinous, fermented or malt liquors, at any place within a distance of five miles Penalty for dis-of or from the located line of the Northern Pacific rail- of any kindroad, and within this state, such person shall, upon con-within what disviction thereof in any court having jurisdiction of the tance-in what same, be fined for every such offense in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, nor less than twenty-five dollars, for the use of the county where [the] offense is committed; and in case the offense is committed in an unorganized county, for the use of the county to which such unorganized county is attached for judicial purposes, and upon default of payment of such fine, he shall be committed to the county jail for a term not exceeding sixty days : Provided, That this act shall not prohibit any regular druggist or apothecary from filling any prescription made out and signed by a licensed physician, and within the line of his practice within said limits.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

CHAPTER XLIX.

An Act to amend Sections four, and seven, of Chapter twenty-five, of the General Statutes of one thousand eight hundred and seventy, relating to the collection and publication of Statistics.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section four (4), Ohapter twenty-five (26), General Laws of 1870. A book to be furnished for said purpose.

Amendment to Section seven (7), Chapter twenty-five (25), General Laws of 1870. When clerk to transmit certified copy of the Registry to Olerk of District Court—compensation—penalty for neglect of duty—when to report to Commissioner of Statistics—fee of Olerks.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That sections four and seven, of chapter twenty-five, of the general laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy, be so amended as to read as follows:

Amend section four by adding thereto the following :

Sec. 4. And the county auditor of each county shall furnish each city and town clerk within his county, at the expense of the county, a book in which to register the facts concerning the births and deaths as above provided.

Sec. 7. The clerk of each city and town shall annually on or before the tenth day of January, transmit to the clerk of the district court of the county embracing such city or town, a certified copy of the registry of births and
