## CHAPTER CXXXVI.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY TO PAY REWARDS OF-FERED BY THE GOVERNOR OF THIS STATE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That whereas, the governor of this state, on the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred James Whitehead and seventy two, offered, by his official proclamation, to viction of Indian pay on behalf of the state one thousand dollars to whom- murderersoever should procure the arrest and conviction of any person that had participated in the murder of John Cook, or his family, in the county of Becker, in this state, in the month of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventv-two.

And whereas, James Whitehead did arrest and cause to be tried and convicted of the said offense, one of said murderers, namely, Kah-kah-be-sha, a Chippewa Indian.

Now, therefore, the sum of one thousand dollars, from any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, be and the same is hereby appropriated, to be paid the said James Whitehead for his said services.

Sec. 2. That two thousand dollars, or so much thereof

as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby approramily murderers pristed out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwiseappropriated, to enable the governor of this state to pay further rewards, according to the terms and conditions of the proclamation by which the same were offered, to any person who may cause the further arrest and conviction of any other person or persons, for the murder of said John Cook or any member of his family, or of being accessory to the offense, the same to be paid upon the order and certificate of the governor, after such conviction shall be had.

Act takes effect.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER CXXXVII.

AN ACT APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR THE PURCHASE OF A. LIBRARY FOR THE USE OF THE CONVICTS IN THE STATE PRISON.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Library in State prison-\$500.

SECTION 1. That the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury of this state belonging to the revenue fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of purchasing a library for the use of the convicts in the state prison of this state.

Said library shall be selected and purchased by the inspectors of said prison, and shall be kept within the walls of said prison, and shall at all times be open for the free use of said convicts, under such rules and regulations in reference to the distribution of the books in said library as said inspectors may prescribe.

By whom purchased, and how kept.

No book in said library shall be loaned to any Use of the books, person other than a convict within said prison, nor shall any such book be taken out of or away from said prison.

This act shall take effect and be in force from SEC. 4.
