

where such offense shall have been committed, and such justice shall upon such complaint being made, issue his warrant for the arrest of the offender, and shall upon the arrest of such offender and the return of such warrant, proceed to hear and determine the matter in issue in the same manner as in other cases, and every person convicted of the violation of the provisions of this act, shall stand committed until such fine is paid. *Provided*, That such imprisonment shall not exceed one month.

Act takes effect.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XXVI.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE DESTRUCTION OF FISH FROM THE WATERS OF WAUCONIA AND MINNETONKA LAKES IN CARVER COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Unlawful to take what fish, and when.

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to catch, kill, spear or destroy for the purpose of sale, any fish known by the name of pike, pickerel or bass, from either of the above mentioned lakes, or from any inlet or outlet thereof, situated and being in the county of Carver, and state of Minnesota, between the fifteenth day of March and the fifteenth day of May in any year.

Penalty.

SEC. 2. Any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of the preceding section, shall, upon conviction thereof, suffer a fine of five dollars for each fish so caught, killed or destroyed, together with the cost of prosecution.

Prosecutions.

SEC. 3. All prosecutions under the provisions of this chapter shall be commenced within one month after such offense was committed, and shall be conducted in the same manner as provided for in section ten of chapter thirty-three, general laws of Minnesota for one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of supervisors and con-

stables of towns having knowledge of the violation of any of the provisions of this chapter to make complaint thereof, to any justice of the peace of said county, and any other person having such knowledge may make complaint before such justice, and the said justice shall issue his warrant for the arrest of the offender, and proceed to hear and determine the matter in issue in the same manner as provided in other cases, and every person convicted under any of the provisions of this chapter shall stand committed until such fine is paid. *Provided*, That such imprisonment shall not exceed one month.

Duty of supervisors and constables.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Act takes effect

CHAPTER XXVII.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE NON-RESIDENT RAILROAD COMPANIES TO BUILD RAILROADS IN MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That any railroad company heretofore organized under the laws of the state of Iowa is hereby authorized to extend and build its road into the state of Minnesota, and such railroad company shall have and possess all the powers, franchises and privileges, and be subject to the same liabilities of railroad companies organized and incorporated under the general laws of this state; *Provided*, Such non-resident company shall first file a true copy of its articles of incorporation with the secretary of this state, and shall comply with the laws of Minnesota as to filing and recording its articles of incorporation, and shall keep an office in this state in the same county in which its railroad is, or is proposed to be built, and shall be liable to civil process to be sued and to sue as provided by law.

Railroad companies organized under Iowa law granted same powers in this state.

Conditions required.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Act takes effect.
