

CHAPTER LXXI.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION ONE OF CHAPTER THIRTY-FIVE OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO, ENTITLED AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE SEVERAL DISTRICT COURTS OF THIS STATE TO CHANGE THE NAME OF PERSON OR PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one of chapter thirty-five of the general laws of the year one thousand eight hundred of seventy-two be amended so as to read as follows:

Exclusive right
to change per-
sons name.

Section 1. The several district courts of this state shall hereafter have the exclusive right to change the name of any person, and to make such person the heir-at-law of any person whose heir-at-law such applicant applied to be made, when applied to for those or either of those purposes, as hereinafter provided.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXII.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION FOUR OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND SEVEN OF THE GENERAL STATUTES RELATING TO GRAND JURIES.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Who are exempt
from service as
grand jurors

SECTION 1. The following persons are exempt from service as grand jurors: All United States officers, all judges of courts of record, commissioners of public buildings, auditors and treasurer of state, state librarian, clerks

of courts, registers of deeds, sheriffs and their deputies; coroners, constables, attorneys and counsellors at law, ministers of the gospel, preceptors and teachers of incorporated academies, one teacher in each common school, practising physicians and surgeons, one miller to each grist mill, one ferryman to each licensed ferry, all acting telegraph operators, all members of companies of firemen organized according to law, all persons of more than sixty years of age, all persons not of sound mind or discretion, persons subject to any bodily infirmity amounting to disability. All persons are disqualified from serving as grand jurors who have been convicted of any infamous crime.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXIII.

AN ACT FIXING THE TIME OF HOLDING THE GENERAL TERMS OF COURT IN THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The general terms of the district court of the first judicial district of this state shall be held at the times following:

In the county of Goodhue on the first Tuesday in May, and the second Tuesday in December in each year. Terms of court in Goodhue county.

In the county of Dakota on the third Tuesday in January and the third Tuesday in June in each year. Dakota county.

In the county of Washington on the fourth Tuesday in May and the second Tuesday in November in each year. Washington county.

In the county of Pine on the first Tuesday in October in each year. Pine county.

In the county of Chisago on the third Tuesday in October in each year. Chisago county.

SEC. 2. All processes, writs, bonds, recognizances, continuances, appeals, notices, proceedings, and all other papers, issued, made or returnable to the terms of said All proceedings returnable to the terms here fixed.
