SEC. 2. Said association, when duly organized, and after complying with certain conditions hereinatter specified, shall be, and hereby is authorized to open such ditches or canals as shall be found necessary to flow off the surplus waters from said Chisago Lake; *Provided*, That nothing in this act shall authorize the lowering of said lake below ordinary low water mark.

SEC. 3. Before commencing any work authorized by this act said association shall be required to give bonds in the penal sum of one thousand dollars running to the chairmain of county commissioners of Chisago county, conditioned that said association shall not lower or cause to be lowered the waters of said lake below the ordinary low water mark, and that it shall pay all damages assessed as hereinafter provided that may arise from the flowing of water over the lands of any person.

SEC. 4. The board of county commissioners of said county, or a majority of them, is hereby empowered to assess all damages that may be suffered by any person or persons from the operations of said association to be paid by said association to such injured person or persons; subject to appeal to the district court.

SEC. 5. Each commissioner acting as such assessor shall receive as compensation for time employed in estimating and assessing such damages, and for time required in going to and from such place to which he may have been called to make such assessment, the same per diem and allowance allowed by the county for like services; said compensation to be paid by said association.

SEC. 6. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXIII.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE DRAINING OF CLEAR LAKE, SITUATED IN THE TOWN OF WOODVILLE, IN WASECA COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnessta:

SECTION 1. That all persons are hereby prohibited from digging into or in any way disturbing the shores of Clear Lake, said lake being situated in the town of Woodville, Waseca county; or from 33

doing any act with intent to drain said lake or make a reservoir thereof, or raise or lower the water of the same, or in any way to change or attempt to change the natural condition of said lake for milling purposes, or any purpose whatever.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and so much of all acts and parts of acts as are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

CHAPTERGLXIV.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF CATTLE AND OTHER DOMESTIC ANIMALS WITHIN THE COUNTY OF GOODHUE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to allow any cattle, horses, or other domestic animals, owned by them, or of which they may be in possession, or have control, to run at large upon the public highways, or upon the lands of any other person, during any season of the year; *Provided*, That the provisions of this section shall not apply to any portion of the state of Minnesota except the county of Goodhue.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of April, A. D. 1874.

SEC. 3. All laws inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER LXV.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE BUNNING AT LARGE OF CATTLE OR OTHER DOMESTIC ANIMALS WITHIN THE COUNTY OF NOBLES.
