SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XV.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND THREE OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, RELATING TO DEMANDING FUGITIVES FROM JUSTICE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Proceedings when fugitives from justice are demanded by executive of another state.

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter one hundred and three of the general statutes of the state of Minnesota is hereby amended so as to read as follows, viz. : When a demand is made upon the governor by the executive of any state or territory in any case authorized by the constitution and laws of the United States for the delivery over of any person charged in such state or territory with treason, felony or any other crime, the attorney general, when required by the governor, shall forthwith investigate the ground of such demand, or cause the same to be investigated by any county attorney and report to the governor all material facts which may come to his knowledge, or to the situation and circumstances of the person so demanded, especially whether he is held in custody or is under recognizance to answer for any offense against the laws of the state or of the United States, and also whether such demand is made according to law, so that such person ought to be delivered up, and if the governor is notified that such demand is conformable to law and ought to be complied with, he shall issue his

warrant under the seal of the state authorizing such person as he shall name therein, either forthwith or at the time designated by the warrant, to take and transport the person so demanded to the line of the state at the expense of the state or territory in whose name such person may have been demanded, and to deliver over such person at the line of the state to the agent of the state or territory making such demand; and shall also by such warrant require the civil officers within this state to afford all needful assistance in the execution thereof.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. When act to take effect.

CHAPTER XVI.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION FORTY-TWO OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF MINNESOTA, AS THE SAME IS AMENDED BY CHAPTER FORTY-SEVEN OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF 1871, RELATING TO JAILS AND PRISONS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section forty-two of chapter one hundred and twenty of the general statutes of Minnesota, as the same is amended by chapter forty-seven, of the general laws of 1871, be amended by making the paragraph prescribing the compensation of inspection [inspectors] of the state's prison read as follows: "To the inspector[s] the sum of five dollars per day for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties, and traveling fees at the rate of six cents per mile for every mile necessarily traveled in the performance of their official duties." Per diem of inspectors.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. When act to take effect.
