JOINT RESOLUTION FOR THE RELIEF OF DESTITUTE EMIGRANTS.

WHEREAS, Most of the emigrants coming to Minnesota have been attracted by the emigration documents published and annually distributed by the state; and

WHEREAS, Among this large number of emigrants many cases of destitution occur, from various sources, such as loss of baggage, loss of money by sharpers on railroad trains, over charges by transportation companies, sickness, or even death while in transit; and

WHEREAS, Emigrants thus afflicted expect aid and assistance from the state authorities; and

WHEREAS, Common humanity requires that the state makes provision for such cases of misfortune; therefore

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated and placed at the disposal of the governor, to be used by him for the relief of such cases of destitution and suffering among emigrants, which, in his opinion require the intervention and protection of the state.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and he in force from and after its passage.

JOINT RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, The governor of this state, in the year A. D. eighteen hundred and seventy-three, did offer in behalf of said state, to pay a reward of two hundred and fifty dollars for the arrest and return to this state of Geo. W. Donahue and A. J. Donahue, accu-

sed and indicted for the murder of James Flynn, in the county of Meeker, and who had fled from the state and were concealed out of the same, to avoid the punishment for said crime; and

WHEREAS, M. Baldwin, of said county, did, pursuant to the offer to pay said reward, pursue and capture the said criminals in the state of Kentucky, and return them to this state and deliver them to the proper legal authorities of said county, one of whom has been tried, convicted and sentenced to the state prison therefor, (the other now under bail to appear at court;) and

WHEREAS, The said reward has not yet been paid by the state; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota;

That two hundred and fifty dollars be and is hereby appropriated to the said M. Baldwin, or his assigns, to be paid out of the state treasury out of any money not otherwise appropriated.
