

Catching with  
gill nets unlaw-  
ful.

SEC. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to catch fish in the running waters of said lake or in any of the inlets or outlets of said lake, with a gill net, but not in the still waters of said lake or inlets or outlets.

Penalty for vio-  
lation.

SEC. 3. Any person catching fish in said lake contrary to the provisions of this act shall, on conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and fined five dollars for each offense.

When act to  
take effect.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER CXXXII.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER FORTY-FOUR, GENERAL LAWS EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR, ENTITLED, "AN ACT TO MAKE IT LAWFUL TO CATCH FISH WITH NETS IN CERTAIN LAKES IN KANDIYOHICOUNTY."

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That section one of chapter forty-four of the general laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows, to-wit:

SEC. 2. That it shall be lawful for any person, at all times, to catch fish with nets, in which the meshes are not less than one and one-half inches across, in Foote Lake, Eagle Lake, Grass Lake, Green Lake, Norway Lake, Lake Andrews, and Lake Honada.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER CXXXIII.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE KILLING OF DEER IN THE COUNTIES OF FILLMORE AND OLMTED PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.
