

CHAPTER 29.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION TWO HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE (231) OF CHAPTER SIXTY-SIX (66) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES, IN REFERENCE TO TRIAL BY REFEREES.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Adds to section 231 of chapter 66 of General Statutes.

Upon a finding of a referee being set aside, the case shall go upon the calendar the same as though no reference had been made.

SECTION 1. Section two hundred and thirty-one (231) of chapter sixty-six (66) of the general statutes of the State, is hereby amended by adding the following proviso at the end of said section: *Provided*, that whenever a finding has been made, or a decision or a judgment rendered upon the finding of the referee or referees, and the said finding or decision shall be set aside or a new trial granted in the action, the cause referred shall be placed upon the calendar for trial by the court or a jury, as the case may be, the same as though no reference had ever been made, subject nevertheless to the same right of reference as in the first instance.

CHAPTER 30.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION TWO HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE (281) OF CHAPTER SIXTY-SIX (66) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES, IN REFERENCE TO EXEMPTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Amends section 281 of chapter 66 of General Statutes.

Damages obtained for exempt property wrongfully taken or detained, exempt from attachment, &c.

SECTION 1. That section two hundred and eighty-one (281) of chapter sixty-six (66) of the general statutes, be amended so as to read:

Sec. 281. Whenever any personal property exempt as aforesaid, is levied upon, seized or sold by virtue of any execution, or wrongfully and unlawfully taken or detained by any person, the damages sustained by the owner thereof, by reason of such levy, seizure or sale, or such unlawful detention or taking, and any judgment recovered therefor shall be exempt from attachment, execution or other proceeding whereby any creditor of such owner seeks to apply the same to the payment of his debts.

When act to take effect.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
