one hundred and ten (110), range twenty-two (22), being in the township of Shieldsville; and all of section thirty-six (36) of township one hundred and eleven (111), range twenty-two (22), being in the township of Erin, shall be and is hereby constituted the village of Shieldsville, under and subject to the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirty-nine (139) of the General Laws of A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875); and Pat. McKenna, Joseph Hagerty, and Matthew Brown, are designated as the persons to act under section nine (9) of said chapter, in calling the first election in said village.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after

its passage,

CHAPTER 16.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF MAZEPPA, IN THE COUNTY OF WABASHAW, AND STATE OF MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. The following described territory, in the county of Wabashaw, State of Minnesota, to-wit: Section six (6), of township number one hundred and nine (109), north of range number fourteen (14) west, be and the same is hereby set apart for incor-

poration as the village of Mazeppa.

SEC. 2. That the following named persons are designated as commissioners, under the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875), providing for the organization of villages in the State of Minnesota, to post notices of the first election, and to conduct the same in said village, to-wit: I. Roberson, G. Maxwell, and O. D. Ford.

Sec. 3. That upon organization, as directed in the general laws aforesaid of this State, the said territory shall constitute the village of Mazeppa, and the inhabitants thereof shall thereupon be endowed with all the rights, powers, and duties therein pre-

scribed for organizing villages in this State.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
